## ANZAC DAY in Clunes



During his address at the Clunes War Memorial on ANZAC Day, RSL President Kevin Kinnersly spoke of the young returned soldier, Private Arthur Fell, who was the model for many of the marble statues that appeared on war memorials across Victoria after World War 1. Arthur Fell had a family connection with Clunes as he was a descendant of William Fell who had the first creek crossing before the Service Street Bridge was built.

The theme of youth and family has been part of Clunes ANZAC services for many years. Youth groups such as Guides and Brownies, Scouts and Cubs, Youth Club, Primary School students and in recent years, Wesley College students when in residence, have joined in the march and taken part in the service at the Town Hall at various times. Now, young grandsons are stepping forward to carry the flags each year, just as Dennis Hawkes carries on a family tradition as bugler, and daughters and granddaughters are lending willing hands to carry on the RSL tradition of hospitality.

This year the involvement of young people was carried further when the Clunes Primary School students formed a guard of honour near the War Memorial, where a crowd of about 300 observed the solemn wreath-laying and commemoration service.

As part of the Town Hall service three young relatives of RSL Members were invited to share their thoughts about ANZAC Day with us; Sam Baird great-grandson of Kevin & Betty Kinnersly, Bethany Higgins granddaughter of Jack & Jean Higgins, and Jaqui Hill granddaughter of Syd and Betty Duncan.

Standing in front of the historic World War 1 Memorial Mural which commemorates the service of the many young Clunes men and women who served their country almost a hundred years ago, and speaking to a capacity crowd in the town Hall, Sam Beth and Jaqui delivered speeches which were thoughtful, well researched and clearly showed the love and respect they have for the returned service people. Aspects they touched on included, a growing understanding of the history of Gallipoli and the contribution of service personnel in all the subsequent wars and operations right up to the present. They spoke of how the values of the ANZACs can be applied in their own lives, an appreciation of our way of life, what it means to take part in the service rather than just to watch it, ways in which modern technology can be used to record the history of veterans, and the meaning of mateship and friendship in a modern world.

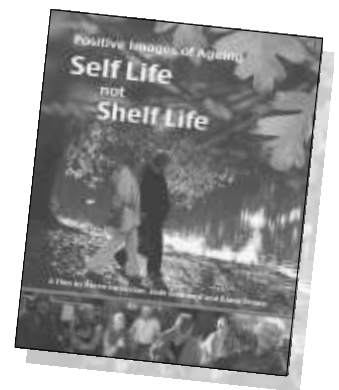
Listening to these young representatives of their generation speak of their respect for the past and their vision for the future, RSL members and others present felt reassured that our history will be well preserved and that the future of ANZAC Day and other commemorations is in safe hands. G'day everyone, its that time again when I get to put my wordsmith skills to use?? I hope that everyone has recovered from the Booktown weekend. This was the first time that I've been in Clunes for this event and although I'd been told that it was a big weekend, I had no idea it was THAT big. Congratulations to everyone who was involved, well done. I was pleased we only had a couple of reported incident from the weekend, one being the opportunist theft of a handbag and the other a theft from the IGA. Both incidents are still being investigated. Otherwise it has been a relatively quiet couple of months, police wise, in the area.

One thing that I'd like to mention is the use of RMB and RSD numbers for residences in the rural area. These residential numbers have been superseded by the Rural Residence Numbering Scheme, I note that most of the rural properties that I have had to visit are correctly numbered and that makes it easy for me, and other emergency services, to find. The historical RMB and RSD numbers are confusing and quite often not in any resemblance of an order and thus make it very difficult to locate properties, especially when most of the neighbouring properties are correctly identified. If your property

is still displaying an old RSD or RMB number I implore you to contact the Hepburn Shire, who can advise you of the correct Rural Residence Number for your property and ask that you please display this number on your property. It may be the difference in emergency services being able to locate your property quickly or not.

I have had a few people contact me in regards to obtaining a Police check. The system has now changed and to obtain 'National Police Certificate', you need to go to the Victoria Police website at [www.police.vic.gov.au](http://www.police.vic.gov.au) and follow the prompts under the 'Our Services' area. I have put some instruction cards in the Mini Police Station at the Post Office for your use. Unfortunately I am unable to download the blank forms and display them, if you are having trouble with the form or do not have access to the internet then please feel free to contact me and I will be able to help you complete the form at the police station.

I was lucky enough to be able to speak at the Clunes Probus Club meeting on the 12<sup>th</sup> of May, thanks to Barbara for the invitation, (hopefully I wasn't too boring). I am more than happy to come and speak to any of the clubs around the area if invited, the only thing I ask, is for a little notice so I can organise my roster. As I said to the Probus Club, I am YOUR local copper and more than happy to help out if I can.

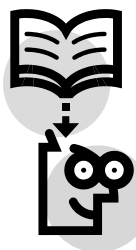

# This Could be Your Heaven on Earth

This exotic statement was how the estate agent announced the recent sale of the former Catholic presbytery at Clunes, bringing to an end an era that began when gold was still 'king' in the local economy.

Built in 1904, the St. Thomas Aquinas Church presbytery is a soundly constructed solid brick residence. Its 'grand' design reflects typical features of the times with, according to the agent, *a massive central passage, high ceilings, beautiful cornice and ceiling roses, enchanting fireplaces and surrounds complemented by superb lead lighting.* A garage building complete with laundry and two bedrooms was added in 1927.

The seven roomed residence housed the parish clergy for nearly 70 years until the parish was amalgamated with Creswick. For then until 2006, when the parish made the decision to sell the property, it was occupied by a parishioner family.

Since the church and the presbytery were on a single title it was necessary to subdivide the land and install infra-structure to bring the church and dwelling in compliance with regulations. This process took two years.

On March 28<sup>th</sup> 2009, after spirited bidding, ownership was transferred to a young family, new to Clunes, who plan to refurbish the property and live in it.

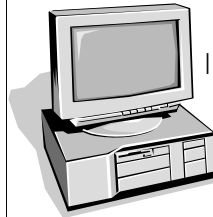

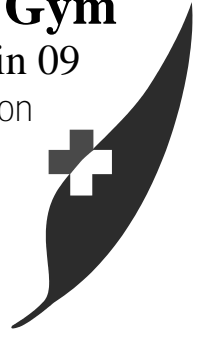

But the genii is out of the bottle and judging by the mass of volunteers this year and the proven benefit to the groups that participate; it has been accepted by the townspeople. I'll grumble no more.

Before you cry "Hypocrite", I was lucky to be selected to attend the Masterclass on the BookTown Weekend, along with the gentlemanly Doug from Quince Farm and the premier storyteller, historian and great beauty Anne E Stewart.

## The Train Must Stop at Clunes

The State Government is to be applauded for its decision to return the passenger train service to Clunes, after 20 years or so after seeing it withdrawn by the Kennett Government. However, to make the maximum use of this investment in the district's future transport needs, it is imperative the train stops at Clunes.

V/Line officials have visited the intermediate stations between Ballarat and Maryborough (Creswick, Clunes, Talbot) and are working their figures and projections on where it is viable to stop. This project team report to the 'Minister' and quite a huddle goes on as to the politics of decisions made.

From all accounts so far there is not much enthusiasm to stop at Clunes. It is important that if the government is investing this sizeable amount of money into this service that, within reason, all the towns in the electorate of our local member, Joe Helper, have the advantage and benefit of this passenger service.

With Clunes having had 15,000 people attend Booktown and the view overall, that tourism is an important factor in our development, to put Clunes back on the railway map is vital. Rail patronage in Victoria is showing incredible increases both rural and suburban areas. The electrification of the line to Sunbury and the building and electrification of the line to South Morang is to be applauded. The opening of the new station at Wendouree is most welcome.

Whilst the government is investing the taxpayers money into rail development on the Maryborough sector, it is vital the maximum use be made of the investment by stopping at Clunes and Creswick.

Railways inherently attract passengers, more than buses do, and this can be seen where rail services have been provided such as the extension of the South Geelong service to Marshall, and the Bendigo service to Eaglehawk. The re-opening of the station at Kangaroo Flat has had a very strong growth in patronage. The Ararat service, stopping at Beaufort, has been most viable.

Well, why not stop at Clunes as with Beaufort on the Ararat line.

The V/Line bus service to Ballarat leaves Clunes just after 9am and around 10 people per day board this. It is not unreasonable to expect that a train would see and increase in that patronage, and, if it arrived in Ballarat at a time to allow people to go to work, school, university, hospital appointments etc. it is logical, based on results elsewhere, the service would arrive at Ballarat with quite a payload of passengers.

Frank Moorhouse, the nation's superlative writer of short stories was in fine fettle though his obsession with file cards annoyed me, or would have if I was a paid up participant. The novelist, Matthew Condon's explanation of his dual life as a journo and a fiction writer was most entertaining. Especially the dishing of dirt on Pauline Hansen and her interest in leather gear, despite the shocking photos in the press not being her. Eva Hornung's attention to research was astonishing, learning Russian and chasing wild dog packs through the rubbish heaps of Moscow, a bit repugnant. But you can't fault her dedication.

Some of the attendees were as fascinating as the writers on show. I meet a professional bird caller. Obviously I asked her to demonstrate and asked her to do a Pallid Cuckoo. And lo, in the bowling club, a perfect rendition. (I had heard one in town the week before.) Then without prompting, a baby kookaburra. Also perfect but by the strangling noises she was emitting I thought I might have to administer the Heimlich Manoeuvre.

Through the weekend I noticed more Clunatics having stalls than last year. I bet some real gems were parted with, knowing some of the collections that those books came from.

The devils on horseback served at the Martini party at Keebles were adjudged *ne plus ultra* and Mr. Moorhouse, an expert on that deadly aperitif, so comfortably ensconced, he swore he'd be back next year. As will we all. God willing.

If the bus service from Maryborough to Ballarat ran express through Clunes, it would be the most illogical outcome and yet, there is the possibility that this sizeable investment of money by the state government may not take advantage of all the potential passenger support along the line by stopping at Clunes.

It is important we lobby our local member and others of the state parliament to ensure that our case is heard and more importantly won. If the government wants to see the electorate satisfied with their decision to return the train service, the overall electorate must benefit from the decision, not just one end of it.

This is the start of a campaign to ensure Clunes is on the railway map and a proper, maximum use of the state finances are invested so that all the electorate can benefit from the return of the passenger train service.
