State Government Grant to Clunes RSL

On Wednesday July 1st, Tony Robinson, MLA Minister for Gaming, Consumer Affairs, Minister Assisting the Premier on Veterans Affairs, visited the Clunes RSL Sub-Branch, to announce a State Government grant of \$102,000. The building also houses a growing collection of memorabilia.

The RSL Devonshire Teas and Sausage Sizzle are an integral part of the Clunes Monthly Market and the Clunes Book Town Weekend. Members were delighted to receive this assistance as part of the State Government's commitment to Sub-Branches that are part of their community.

President's Report From Neil Newitt

On Monday July 20th, the Clunes Tourist and Development Association (CTDA) held its Annual General Meeting and election of Executive and Management Team for 2009-2010.

As the incoming president, I would like to thank the previous CTDA Management Team for their achievements during the past year, and along with the new committee look forward to the next 12 months.

The CTDA has been representing the Clunes community for close on 30 years. During the last 12 months events such as the Community Dinner, Clunes' Australia Day activities, and Banquet@Bailey have continued to both raise funds and celebrate the local community.

A quick look around Clunes today reveals a flurry of activity. New and expanded businesses have opened this year. Major works are underway in Collins Place. The Clunes Museum, Library, and the Lee Medlyn Complex (bottle museum) have all undergone recent or continuing renovations.

This new work is indicative of the increase in activity in the town in general. The primary school has had a 20% increase in numbers. This year saw families make the move to Clunes from Melbourne and as far as northern West Australia. New home construction and extensions to existing premises are evident throughout the Clunes area. The opening of the Deer Park by-pass now makes it easier to travel to and from Melbourne. Visitor numbers are up.

The continuing success of events like Booktown, and the use of the town as a film and television location has raised Clunes' profile within the greater Victorian community. So it's a good time to feel positive about Clunes and its future.

In the 1800's the gold discovery and subsequent rush to Clunes significantly added to the wealth and prosperity of the state. Clunes is again being discovered. But the rewards today are from the lifestyle afforded by living within a rural community, encompassing traditional industry (such as agriculture), along with tourism and emerging new business opportunities unique to a heritage town. And all within two hours of Victoria's major centres of population.







3 cups SR Flour 1 cup Cream 1 cup Lemonade Pinch of Salt

Pre-heat oven to 230 degrees C (fan forced)

- 1. Sift Flour and Salt into mixing bowl
- 2. Add Lemonade and Cream at same time
- 3. Stir into a soft dough
- 4. Put dough onto floured surface, lightly roll and cut to desired thickness
- 5. Put scones onto well-greased baking tray
- 6. Bake for about 12 minutes until golden on top
