History Preserved in Talbot and Clunes

Publication of a war diary and creation of a fascinating display depicting a Talbot pioneer watchmaker and jeweller have resulted from a project cataloguing local photographs and other items.

Local Heritagecare volunteers Denise O'Regan, Alan Davis, Ken Tester and Nova Tippins have worked two days a week over the last six months to add 3,185 records about the Talbot Arts & Historical Museum's collection to its searchable database.

The records relate to documents, photos and ephemera donated to the Arts & Historical Museum by the Shire and other community organisations, including ANA, Masonic Lodge and IOOF, as well some items in Talbot's recently opened Australian Communications Museum.

The collection of photos, letters, memorabilia and materials used in trades donated by Harold Edwards and his family were also catalogued and displayed, providing a fascinating and informative overview of family life and the watchmaking and jewellers trades in the Talbot area in the mid to late 19th century.

Material uncovered by volunteers also led to the Society publishing the diary and photographs of Bandsman HE Krutli, D Company, 14th Battalion, 4th Infantry Brigade, Australian Imperial Forces (AIF) September 1914 to April 1916.

The Heritagecare program is a partnership between the State Government agency Heritage Victoria and Conservation Volunteers Australia (CVA), which recruits volunteers and manages projects on behalf of Heritage Victoria.

The Brumby Government is providing more than 1.7 million over four years (2006-2010) for Heritagecare, as part of its strategy Victoria's Heritage: Strengthening our communities.

CVA Heritagecare Project Officer Heather McNaught thanked the volunteers for their contribution and presented them with Certificates of Appreciation.

Robin McRobinson, President of the Committee of Management of the Museum also thanked volunteers, highlighting that "The success of the project at Talbot has come from the dedication and work ethic of the Heritagecare volunteers."

"With each of them bringing particular skills and knowledge to the project, they have been a valuable asset to our Museum," Mr McRobinson said.

Planning Minister Justin Madden said the Heritagecare program empowered local communities to care for their treasured heritage assets.

"The Brumby Government is proud to support the community groups and volunteers who do such an important job caring for local heritage places and objects," he said.

The campaign will result in the publication of a local business directory and an accompanying 4 week community wide Buy Local Marketing Campaign.



Queens Park & Parterre Committee News Update

A meeting was held on 27th February to discuss issues relevant to these areas, and their ongoing assessment and management.

Queens Park (including Pinetum)

A report is being prepared for submission to Council detailing all the stressed and dead trees in the in these areas. Consultation with Council; will follow, and details of the action necessary to deal with the problems, will be reported in the Clunes Newsletter as ASAP.

Queens Park (An Oral History)

The Park has been a venue for many community events, especially in years gone by. The actual appearance of it's gardens has also changed for many reasons – drought being a major cause. It is hoped to gradually stimulate new life into both these areas, whilst not losing sight of its history.

With this in mind, it is planned to document the history, by collecting as much knowledge, via stories and pictures, of our lovely local asset.

If anyone can recall memories of past scenes or events, we would love to hear from them. A collection box for this information, will be placed in town, and the contents discussed and documented by a local historian and published in this 'Oral History of Queens Park'.



Train Service at Clunes Update

The Committee For A Train Service at Clunes meets regularly to continue the campaign to have the passenger train stop at Clunes. We believe we are making ground on the issue as the State election draws closer. There has been an amount of work taking place on the track in the station area. This has been the construction of a siding to place track maintenance machines on, whilst trains pass by and is not part of a station upgrade.

The Transport Survey forms were mailed to property owners by the Hepburn Shire Council. The Committee for a Train Service at Clunes is concerned at the lack of consultation from the Council to our Committee in the development of the survey form. The survey deals with the local issue of transport from Clunes by offering various options, whereas the matter of having the train stop at Clunes is a much wider issue of not only providing transport for people to join at Clunes to travel both

towards Ballarat and Maryborough, but also to bring people into the town, such as tourists, school students and others. The campaign to have the train stop at Clunes is not just about local travel from Clunes and it deals travel issues overall along the growth corridor, acknowledged by the state government, between Ballarat to Maryborough.

The Committee For A Train Service at Clunes wish to point out that answers to the survey need to be thought out wisely, so that the results cannot be skewed to take the argument away from the principal of seeking to have the train stop at Clunes.

Committee is in the process of becoming incorporated and changing it's name to Transport for Clunes. The next meeting is on the 12th of April, at 7.30pm at the National Hotel. All interested people are welcome to attend.


