ANZAC Day

Students from Clunes Primary School and Wesley College formed a guard of honour along Fraser Street for the traditional ANZAC Day March on Sunday April 25th. The University of Ballarat led the march for the 35th consecutive year. A large crowd joined in the commemoration service at the War Memorial. Wreaths were laid in memory of the Fallen and Bugler Denis Hawkes sounded the Last Post carrying on a tradition started by his late father "Digger" Hawkes after World War 2. RSL President Mr Kevin Kinnersly delivered the ANZAC Requiem and 2 students led The Ode.

A service at the Town Hall followed where Joshua Toole, grandson of Edna and the late Harry Toole, spoke about ANZAC Day and what it means to his generation.

RSL President Kevin Kinnersly followed with an informative address on the events that took place in Darwin starting on 19th February 1942, when the first air raid on Australian soil was carried out by an enemy force, and continuing until 12th November 1943. This is a part of Australian history that is unknown to many.

The service concluded with a retiring collection to aid the work of Legacy. Refreshments at the Club Rooms, provided by the RSL Womens Auxiliary and friends, followed. Several people took the opportunity to place

flowers on the individual crosses in front of the Lone Pine tree at the RSL.

G'day everyone, it's that time again; firstly the Crime round up....

It's been a reasonably quiet month in the Clunes area since the last newsletter. Matters of note include two offenders being charged in relation to two separate burglaries committed on businesses in Clunes. There was also a burglary on a residential house that is still being investigated. I am often asked as to the court results of offenders that are charged in regards to offences within the area. As such I am pleased to report that the youth that was charged and remanded that was referred to in the last newsletter pleaded guilty at the Ballarat Magistrates' Court in late May and received a 3 month term of imprisonment that was suspended for a period of 12 months. The magistrate decided that the 35 days that the offender had already spent in custody was sufficient.

There have been three very serious motor vehicle collisions in the immediate area in the last month, one being just north of Clunes on the Maryborough Road, one on the Creswick Road in Clunes and the third on the

Creswick-Newstead Road at Campbelltown. The Campbelltown and Creswick Road collisions were disappointing in that both drivers were young men, fatigued and affected by alcohol. Both drivers were very lucky to get away with relatively minor injuries considering the extensive damage to their respective vehicles. I would ask that all of us look out for our mates in that if we think they shouldn't be driving, be it for reasons of alcohol consumption or fatigue, that we prevent them from driving a motor vehicle, you may just save their lives.

Operation AEGIS VIII is on again, this time to coincide with the Queens Birthday weekend. The operation will start on the 11th of June and run through till midnight on the 14th June. As usual all available units will be out in force on the roads targeting speed and alcohol related offences across the state. Take care if you are going away and again utilise the cup of tea breaks that will be set up on various highways around the state.

Transport@Clunes (TRAC) News

Meeting with the Minister

The 'Transport at Clunes Committee' was represented by John Sayers and Richard Gilbert from Clunes, along with Max Kau from the Talbot Train Committee, in a meeting with Public Transport Minister, Martin Pakula at the Ministers office on Wednesday, 19th May.

The meeting was quite congenial and the Committee representatives spoke quite freely with Minister Pakula on the issues of seeing the re-introduced passenger train service stop at both Clunes and Talbot. The Minister said even though he understood the issue, the main fact was that there was no funding in the budget for the project for the development of station facilities at both Clunes and Talbot at this stage. He said that there was always hope that funding could be obtained, and he took notes of some suggestions from our local representatives.

The meeting concluded with the Minister stating that we should keep local parliamentary member, Joe Helper, informed of our requests and of any updated information. The Petition, which has been collected within Clunes for some months, asking the Parliament to have the train stop at Clunes will be presented to the Minister by Colleen Hartland, MLC for the Western Metropolitan, during the coming week.

Colleen Hartland came to Booktown and whilst there she was keen to talk with representatives of the 'Transport at Clunes' Committee and those from the Talbot group. A meeting was held on the Sunday of the Booktown weekend and Ms. Hartland was very supportive of the proposal to have the train stop at Clunes and Talbot. Accompanying her was the Greens endorsed candidate for the Seat of Ripon, local resident, Steve Morse. Ms. Hartland stated

it was Greens policy in the state election to support the re-introduced passenger train to stop at Creswick, Clunes and Talbot

The 'Transport at Clunes' Committee continues to work consistently to achieve its aim to have the re-introduced passenger train stop at our local stations and will continue to report our progress to local residents.

The Next Stage in the Campaign

The Committee for a Train Service for Clunes has now applied for incorporation with a name change to Transport@Clunes (TRAC) reflecting concerns with all aspects of public transport for Clunes and district.

Our recent meeting with the Minister for Public Transport has established a good working relationship with the Minister and his advisors, but there is still a lot of work to be done in the months leading up to the election.

TRAC will now implement the second stage of our strategy for inclusion in the re-instated train service, which will see greater pressure being put on the State Government, emphasising the marginal nature of the Labour representation in the electorate of Ripon and the fact that continued failure to include the community of Clunes and Talbot in the train service could likely tip the balance in the seat of Ripon.

TRAC will therefore be seeking more intense responses from other candidates who have to date expressed their support for Clunes. To help us in our campaign, we urge community members to become more active in the battle for the train by writing to the Government and all candidates, to add to the support already received from the Federal Member Catherine King, making it clear that the inclusion of Clunes in the reinstated service is very much an election issue.
