## New Life for Creswick Creek

The newly formed Clunes Waterways Reserve Committee met this month to plan a long term management strategy for the town section of Creswick Creek, and begin the restoration and rejuvenation of one of Clunes most loved natural features.

One of the town's most valuable assets, the creek walk's natural environment is now assured of a carefully considered community based plan to ensure sustainable protection of the waterway and the return of the walk to it's former glory.

Appointed by the DSE, the management group has applied for incorporation and will be working with NCCMA and the Shire of Hepburn in a in partnership that also includes the Angling and Bowling Clubs, Clunes Primary School, Wesley College and the greater community.

President June Johnston emphasised "A vital part of the management group's vision for the creek will be the involvement of the youth of Clunes who will be the future beneficiaries of a rejuvenation project that will see

the natural and unique environment of the creek area re-established and enhanced."

Work has commenced on compiling a detailed map of the creek, an action plan for weed removal and tree planting that will be on display soon and we invite community feedback. To ensure public safety there will also be a careful professional evaluation of the health and condition of the trees. There will be opportunities for community involvement in the removal of rubbish, weeds, the planting of trees, ground cover and importantly fundraising.

This year's first working activity is scheduled for October so keep your eye on the town notice board and the *Community News* for further information.

To help ensure that everybody has the opportunity to be actively involved the committee will be publishing advance notice of future meetings to give all interested people time to attend and feel that they are an integral part of the restoration process.
