Firstly apologies for the lack of an article in the last newsletter as I was away.

So for the last two months the area has been reasonably quiet. There was a reported theft from motor car in mid July. The car was parked in the carport of a residential house and the offender has gained access through the unlocked passenger door and removed property. A young school girl also had her school bag stolen from outside the IGA store when she went in to purchase some items. Both of these offences are what I would call opportunistic. I understand the reasoning behind having to leave school bags outside the IGA store and other shops, but if you can get a friend to keep an eye on them whilst one of you are in the shop and maybe shout them a lolly for their trouble. The schoolgirl was lucky that there weren't any valuables in the bag or some important homework etc. I keep harping on about it but where possible keep your cars locked even when they are in your own driveway and keep your valuables out of site and locked away. There has also been some damage caused to signs out at the campsite at Mount Beckworth, the cost is approx. \$600.00 to have the signs replaced. Any info regrading either of these two offenders would be greatly received.

An offender was charged in July for damaging a private house in Clunes and will appear at Ballarat Magistrates' Court in the next couple of weeks or so.

There was a rather serious collision that occurred on the Maryborough Road, near Dunach during July, in that a small sedan has left the road to the left and collided into a large tree. The driver, from Maryborough was injured,

thankfully not seriously, and taken to the Ballarat Base Hospital. Investigations show that he may have been suffering from fatigue and this may have caused him to lose concentration. I am told that his car was a write off, he was very lucky. A timely reminder to all that fatigue is a major cause of collisions and a concern to us coppers. If you are tired please pull over safely and have a rest, even if you are not that far from home, I know that we have all felt tired and not far from home and thought to ourselves that I am nearly there and I should be alright. It only takes a split second for it all to turn pear shaped.

With the upcoming footy finals, being CHFL, BFL, MDFL and LPFL, please be mindful that the local Highway Patrol Units will be conducting their annual drink drive blitz's' to coincide with the various footy games, take care and don't drink and drive.

#### CLUNES IS BACK ON THE TRANSPORT MAP

The TRAC Committee (Transport At Clunes) is celebrating. A milestone for the future of Clunes has been achieved with the restoration of the Maryborough-Ballarat passenger train service including a stop at Clunes. Since last September, a concerted campaign has been waged by TRAC which has now seen our goal achieved.

The train will give residents easy access to the facilities at Ballarat and Melbourne for those with disabilities, younger people without their own transport, people on lower incomes and potential for group travel to major sporting and entertainment events, and enable Wesley Students to return to Melbourne for weekends.

Member for Western Victoria (Metropolitan) Colleen Hartland, met with the committee and expressed her support for the campaign, offering to assist in presenting the local petition to Parliament. The committee also had a very congenial meeting with Transport Minister Pakula. The Member for Ballarat, Catherine King, supported our cause and wrote to Joe Helper, Member for Ripon, adding her support to our aim of having the train stop at Clunes.

We are so pleased all this work has meant that the passenger train service commenced on Sunday, 25<sup>th</sup> July

and the timetable is the basic one that was offered from the start of the proposal. The V/Line Project Team are to start work on the station area at Clunes soon, and it is expected the station will re-open next year.

The timetable provides for a morning train to Ballarat, and onto Melbourne, returning in the evening. After a period of proving itself, and monitoring patronage, and lobbying by groups such as our TRAC Committee, it is expected a morning trip to Maryborough, returning in the afternoon will eventually be provided, which will enable travel both up and down the line.


For the moment, with me having a part-time job in Melbourne, I will be driving to Creswick, instead of Ballarat, to catch the train to work, and in this way will be offering my support for the re-introduced passenger train service. I look forward to when I can simply walk to my local station to catch the train.

Our town moves forward and I am proud that I have had some input to see this step taken in placing us along with other towns that are blessed with a viable, modern rail service.






## Council Grants for Community Groups: Round 1 (2010-11)

Each year Hepburn Shire Council provides two opportunities for community organisations to apply for funding through its Community Grants Program, to help them develop solutions to identified community needs. Partnering with individual community organisations through community grants aims to assist the development of strong local communities and support the health and well-being of communities within Hepburn Shire.

Round One of the 2010/11 Community Grants Program opened on 16 August and applications close on Friday 17th of September, 2010. 
